Contrition: The penitent examines his/her conscience:

Do I come to the sacrament with a sincere desire for purification, conversion, renewal of life, and deeper friendship with God? Did I deliberately fail to mention grave sins in previous confessions? Have I put into practice the purpose of amendment of life, according to the Gospel?

I. The Lord says: “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.”

II. The Lord says, “This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.”

III. Christ the Lord says: “Whoever has my commandments & observes them is the one who loves me.”

Confession: The penitent makes an integral confession

O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart
 for all the wrong I have done and for the good I have failed to do,
 because by sinning I have offended you,
 who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things.
 I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace,
 to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the occasions of sin.
 Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord have mercy.

Satisfaction: Conversion is achieved by an act of penance as a remedy for sin, by amendment of life, and by reparation of injury. The penitent becomes part of the mystery of salvation.

Absolution: God wishes to confer salvation upon us through visible signs
 God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his son has reconciled the world to himself and poured out the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the church may God grant you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

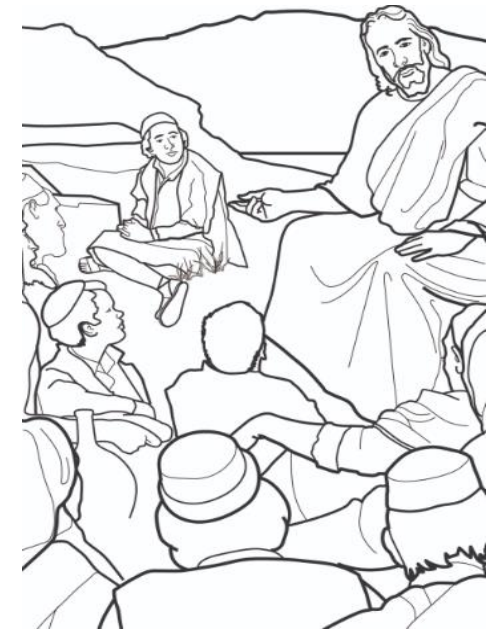

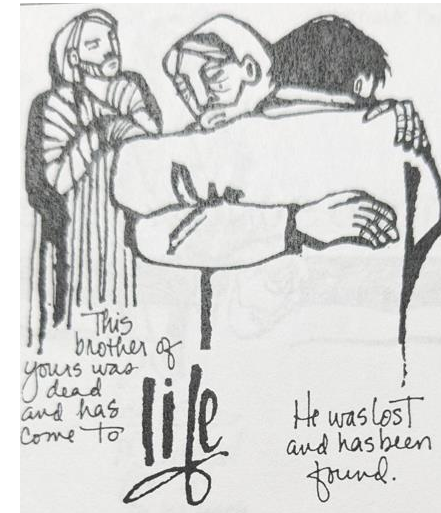

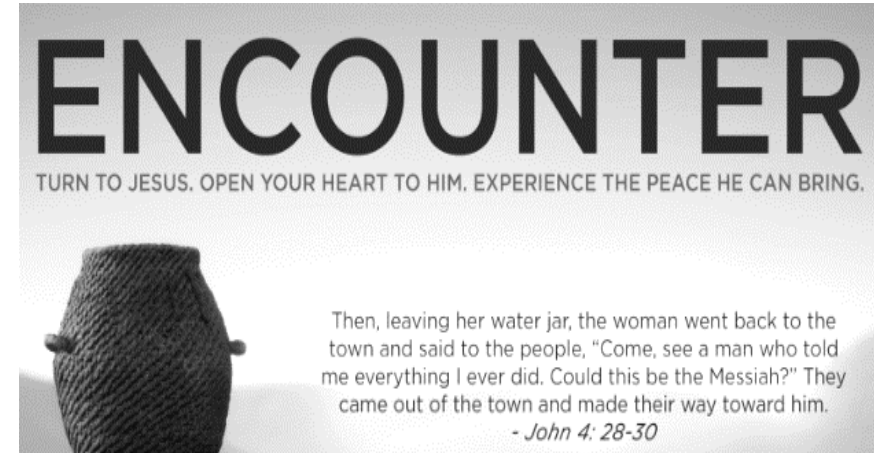
