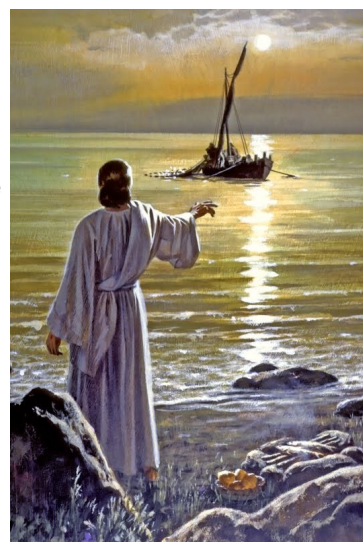


As the mystical Body of Christ, in our Catholic communities, each week we gather to experience this reality in the celebration of the most Holy Eucharist. Far from being merely an event that we attend, it is here, in this sacramental moment, where each of us is drawn into this great mystery of love. In order to draw us more

deeply into this mystery, I hereby declare a Holy Year of the Eucharist in the Diocese of Rapid City to invite each of us in Western, SD to a deeper experience of encounter with Christ in the Celebration of the Eucharist. This Holy Year of the Eucharist will commence on Sunday, 23 June 2019, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and will conclude on the same Solemnity, Sun 14 June 2020.

Today's Gospel Reading: At that time, Jesus revealed himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples didn't realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "Ait is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish.

Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. John 21:1-14

From Bp. Gruss' book on our pastoral priorities: Marriage
Marriage: Though marriage and family life face many challenges today some of which are the result of the weakening of faith and religious practices, a great number of children born out of wedlock often times leading to lives lived below the poverty level, and the effects of migration on family life—we must continue to advocate for families to speak out against things which denigrate the family as God has designed it and to support things in the public sphere that help build up family and marriage. It is important to speak of traditional marriage in a positive light, revealing its beauty and giving young people reason to embrace this life of permanence when the culture does the opposite.

We also must find ways to assist families that are struggling to become stronger— families who are challenged by the complexities of their situation or families which we find living a different lifestyle other than what God desires in the eyes of the Church..
