The relics will be in Gregory Sunday, Spearfish Monday, Rapid City Cathedral Tuesday.

Carlo Acutis was raised in Milan by wealthy parents who were lukewarm in their faith. Upon receiving his first communion at age 7, Carlo became a frequent communicant, making a point of praying before the tabernacle before or after every Mass. In addition to Francis of Assisi, Carlo took several of the younger saints as his models, including Bernadette Soubirous, Jacinta and Francisco Marto, and Dominic Savio. At school Carlo tried to comfort friends whose parents were undergoing divorce, as well as stepping in to defend disabled students from bullies. After school hours he volunteered his time with the city's homeless and destitute. He spent four years creating a website dedicated to cataloguing Eucharistic miracle around the world. He also enjoyed films, comics, soccer, and playing popular video games. Diagnosed with leukemia, Carlo offered his sufferings to God His longtime desire to visit many sites of miracles was cut short by his illness. Carlo died in 2006 and was beatified in 2020.



St. Manuel González Garcia was assigned to a Church poorly attended, where only those getting married or baptizing their children came. The building was dirty, looked abandoned, and the altar cloths torn and burnt. The neglect included the tabernacle covered in dust and cobwebs. He felt someone looking at him: "My faith was looking at Jesus through the door of that tabernacle, so silent, so patient, so good, gazing right back at me... His gaze was telling me much and asking me for more. It was a gaze in which all the sadness of the Gospels was reflected; the sadness of 'no room in the Inn'. The sadness of those words, "Do you also want to leave me?" He prayed, organized, inspiring devotion, and was later ordained a bishop. He died in 1940, was buried near the tabernacle in the Cathedral of Palencia, Spain and canonized in 2016. Victoria Schneider wrote a book: *The Bishop of the Abandoned Tabernacle*.

All Saints Day Is Tuesday 1 November, remembering all those saved by Christ, sharing in the eternal love of heaven, who are not named in the Church's annual calendar of saints. **It is a Holy Day of Obligation**

All Souls Day is Wednesday 2 Nov. We pray for the deceased: "For the souls in purgatory waiting, for eternal happiness and for meeting the Beloved, is a source of suffering, because of the punishment due to sin which separates them from God. But there is also the certitude that once the time of purification is over, the souls will go to meet the One it desires." (*Letter of St. Pope John Paul II for the Millennium of All Soul's Day*)



Suffering has a purpose: the purification that makes one fit to be with the All-Holy Almighty God. As we cooperate with God's mercy, we are completed in the Divine Image in which we were made. Only the pure in heart shall see God (*Mt. 5:8*). Be holy, for I am holy (*1 Pt. 1:16*)

A November prayer for the deceased Loving God, source of all consolation, by the death and resurrection of Jesus we hope for eternal life. We remember our loved ones who have died, for we miss them.
